No Sew Fleece Blankets

The student work instructions must specify the completion of one of the following options, ensuring that the blankets are tied together using yarn:

- Two no-sew tie blankets, or
- One patchwork no-sew tie quilt.

Supplies


For a tied fleece blanket, you only need three things:

- 2 pieces of fleece fabric in coordinating colors 2 yards each for a teen/adult blanket
- ruler
- Sharp Scissors or a rotary cutter and cutting mat Instructions:

Place both pieces of fabric down on the floor, right sides facing out. Smooth out fabric and match up edges. Cut edges straight, trimming through both layers of fabric at once so both layers are the same size.







Cut a 5×5 inch square from each corner of the fabric (you will be treating both layers of fabric as one from here on out). Make 5 inch cuts all the way around the edges of the fabric, 1 inch apart.

Pick up each strip of fabric and tie it in a balloon knot, wrapping the piece around your finger and tying it like you would a balloon.



Continue all the way around the blanket, tying each fringe piece into a knot. After its all tied, please use yarn to hold the two fabrics together.





Patchwork No Sew Blanket

The student work instructions must specify the completion of one of the following options, ensuring that the blankets are tied together using yarn: Two no-sew tie blankets, or One patchwork no-sew tie quilt.

For a tied fleece blanket, you only need three things:

- 2 pieces of fleece fabric in coordinating colors 2 yards each for a teen/adult blanket
- ruler

Supplies

• Sharp Scissors or a rotary cutter and cutting mat

Instructions:

1. Plan the Layout:

Cut all fabric into 10 x 10-inch squares. Add fringes around all edges of each square:



2. Cut the Squares and Fringes:

Fringes should be 1 inch wide and 3 inches long.

Arrange 30 squares (5 rows of 6) in your desired pattern on a flat surface.







3.Tie the Squares Together:

Place two squares back-to-back (wrong sides facing each other). Tie the matching fringes of adjacent squares using a double knot with yarn. Repeat this for all squares in a row.

4.Assemble Rows:

After tying all squares in a row, align adjacent rows. Tie their fringes together, ensuring tight, secure knots.

5.Finish the Blanket:

Check all knots to make sure they are secure. Trim any excess yarn for a clean look.
